Principal Mr. Satyabrata Doloi applauded their dedication, celebrating their achievements as a testament to passion, perseverance, and holistic excellence.





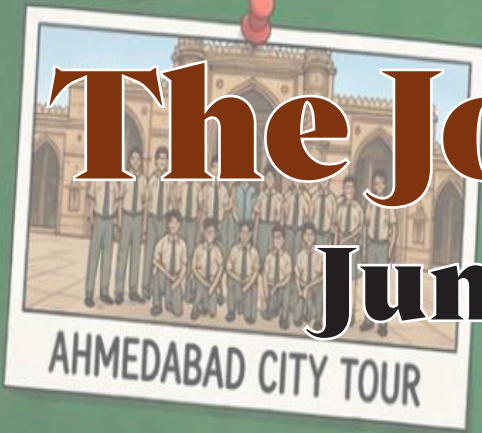
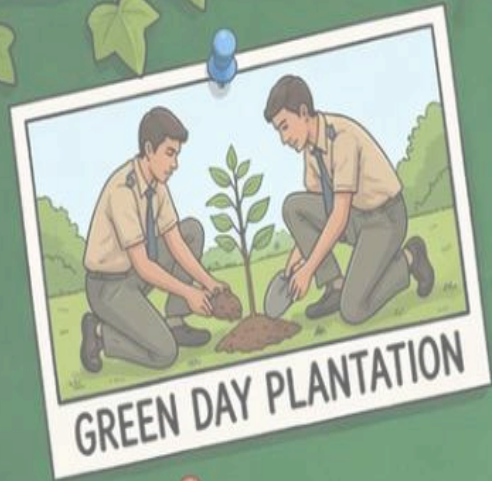
Beyond the Algorithm: Redefining Learning for a New Generation
